

Delhi Police nabs Rohit Godara-Goldy Brar gang member wanted in 18 cases

NEW DELHI: (AGENCY)

The Delhi Police has apprehended a member of the Rohit Godara-Goldy Brar gang, who was wanted in multiple criminal cases and carried a reward of Rs 1 lakh, in Uttar Pradesh's Loni, an official said on Monday.

The accused, Vikas alias Vicky, a resident of Haryana's Mahendergarh district, was wanted in an Arms Act case registered at Chanakyapuri police station.

According to the police, Vikas was an active member of the Rohit Godara-Goldy Brar gang and had played a key logistical role for the syndicate. He was declared a proclaimed offender and is allegedly involved in at least 18 crim-

inal cases spanning four states, including Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan and Maharashtra. In 2023, he reportedly arranged the stay of around 10 gang members in a rented flat in Gurugram, where they had assembled to allegedly plan the murder of Kaushal Chaudhary, leader of the rival Kaushal gang, inside a

court complex. Acting on inputs, police had arrested the gang members from the flat, while Vikas managed to escape, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime Branch) Pankaj Kumar said. Following the incident, a reward of Rs 1 lakh was announced by the Haryana STF for information leading

to his arrest. After about six months, Vikas was apprehended by Haryana Police from Hisar, but he subsequently went underground again after his release.

"During interrogation, Vikas disclosed that he came in contact with gangster Lawrence Bishnoi while lodged in Jaipur jail in 2021," the DCP added.

After factional differences between the Lawrence Bishnoi group and the Rohit Godara-Goldy Brar gang, he allegedly

switched allegiance and became an active operative of the latter, engaging in robbery and extortion to generate funds for the gang. Police further said that in June 2025, Gokly Brar had allegedly made extortion-related threat calls to several businessmen in Delhi. Vikas, along with his associates, was allegedly tasked with executing a firing incident outside a club in Delhi on the directions of the gang leader, but the plan was foiled with the arrest of his associates in the Chanakyapuri area. Vikas was absconding in an Arms Act case registered at Chanakyapuri police station on June 23, last year and had been declared a proclaimed offender in five cases in Haryana.

Delhi Police arrests three more in Turkman Gate clashes, total 16 held

Delhi Police on Friday arrested three more individuals in connection with clashes during an anti-encroachment drive near Faiz Elahi Mosque and a nearby graveyard in Turkman Gate, taking the total number of arrests to 16. The violence erupted on Wednesday when the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) began demolishing structures on land adjoining the mosque. Officials said the mosque itself was not damaged, but social media posts alleging otherwise drew a large crowd. Police estimated 150-200 people were involved in the clashes, injuring six officers, including the local station house officer. The three arrested

on Friday — Mohammad Naved, Mohammad Faiz and Mohammad Ubaidulla — were sent to judicial custody until January 21.



Authorities said they are searching for 10 more suspects. A Delhi court on Friday also remanded eight previously arrested individuals to 12 days of judicial custody. Five others seeking bail alleged assault inside the jail, prompting the court

to issue notices to the police and jail authorities. Police have invoked provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita related to rioting and

obstructing public servants, along with Section 109, which deals

with attempt to murder. The demolition followed a December 22 MCD order declaring structures beyond 0.19 acres around the mosque as encroachments. The move was in line with a November 12 Delhi High Court directive to clear encroachments near Ramlila Ground at Turkman Gate. The mosque's managing committee had challenged the order, and the Delhi High Court on January 6 said the matter "requires consideration."

Delhi: homeless deaths decline, but winter toll remains grim

Under sprawling flyovers and along bustling pavements, hundreds of homeless individuals continue to succumb to the harsh elements each winter. Their deaths often go unnoticed, their lives unremembered, as the city carries on. The Zonal Integrated Police Network (ZIPNET) website has become a chilling archive, filled with photographs of the lifeless — unidentified, unclaimed and forgotten.



While the past week, from December 31, 2025, to January 6, 2026, a total of 34 unidentified dead bodies (UIDBs) were recovered from the streets. During the same period last winter, 67 UIDBs were recorded. While the absolute numbers have declined, an average of more than five deaths a day remains a matter of serious concern. A similar reduction is visible in monthly figures. Between December 1, 2025, and January 6, 2026, 204 unidentified bodies were discovered on Delhi's streets, most of them believed to be homeless. During the same period last winter — from December 2024 to January 2025 — 324 UIDBs were recovered. As tem-

peratures hover just above five degrees Celsius, pavements have once again turned into open graves, raising urgent questions about the city's preparedness to protect its most vulnerable. Despite the drop in numbers, activists say the pattern repeats year after year.

Photographs of the deceased dominate the ZIPNET website. From the frail and elderly to the young and seemingly fit, the biting cold has exposed the vulnerabilities of Delhi's homeless population. Pavements resemble gravesites, while metro pillars stand like tombstones. Despite the recurring toll, government intervention remains limited, leaving non-governmental organisations (NGOs) to shoulder much of the rescue work

During the same winter period last year, 325 homeless individuals were found dead on the city's streets. Both the Centre and the Delhi Government continue to trade blame, offering little relief on the ground. "Pavements have taken the form of gravesites, while metro pillars have become tombstones. However, their deaths remain unheard, with little sign of the authorities coming forward to support them; meanwhile, NGOs go about their business saving those they come across while the unfortunate others perish," said an activist. The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) of India took suo motu cognisance of a report by the Centre for Holistic Development (CHD), which claimed that 474 people died over a 56-day period during the winter of 2024-25 in Delhi. According to CHD, an NGO working with the homeless, these deaths occurred between December 14, 2024, and January 10, 2025, due to the lack of essential protective measures such as warm clothing, blankets and adequate shelter. The organisation further claimed that nearly 80% of unidentified bodies found in Delhi are believed to be homeless individuals.

NEW DELHI: (AGENCY) Aam Aadmi Party MP Raghav Chadha on Monday shared a video of himself dressed as a Blinkit delivery agent and delivering orders, drawing attention to the daily grind of gig workers and renewing his call for better working conditions in India's fast-growing quick commerce sector. Chadha posted a video on X with a caption: "Away from boardrooms, at the grassroots. I lived their day". The AAP leader said he wanted to step away from policy debates and see life at the grassroots. In the video, the Punjab Rajya Sabha MP is seen wearing Blinkit's yellow uniform and a helmet, riding pillion on a delivery partner's motorcycle as they complete multiple orders across the city. The footage follows the pair through what appears to be a regular work shift, offering a glimpse into the pace and pressure of last-mile deliveries. Chadha has been a vocal critic of 10-minute delivery promises made by quick commerce platforms.

Scooter rider injured after being hit by car near Rithala Metro Station; driver absconding

NEW DELHI: (AGENCY) A 35-year-old scooter rider was injured after a car hit his vehicle near Rithala Metro Station in northwest Delhi, an official said on Monday. The accident occurred at around 11.40 pm on Saturday, when a car collided with a scooter. Following the crash, the driver of the car abandoned the vehicle and fled the spot, he said. Police said a PCR call was received regarding the accident, after which a team was rushed to the scene. One injured person was found at the spot and was immediately taken to Dr Baba Saheb Ambedkar Hospital. Due to the severity of his injuries, he was later referred to Lok Nayak Jai Prakash Narayan Hospital for further treatment. The injured was identified as Sukh Nandan. He was riding the scooter at the time of the accident. "The car involved in the accident has been seized. Efforts are underway to trace the absconding driver and identify another injured person," the Delhi police officer said. A case has been registered and further investigation is underway.

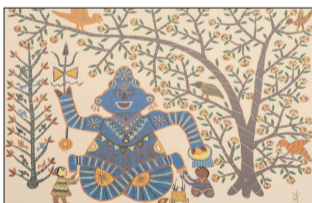
Delivery worker assaulted by store owner in east Delhi for using perfume; case registered

The police took cognisance of the matter and initiated legal action after receiving information about the incident. The delivery boy has been identified as Risha Kumar, a resident of Old Kondli. Preliminary investigations suggest that an altercation broke out between Kumar and the store owner after the teenager allegedly sprayed perfume from the store on himself. The owner noticed the act and started scolding him, leading to a heated argument. The confrontation escalated.

'Bloom at Dusk': a solo exhibition by Jodhaiya Bai Baiga

A solo exhibition titled 'Bloom at Dusk', showcasing works by indigenous artist Jodhaiya Bai Baiga (1937-2024), will open at Ojas Art, New Delhi, on January 23. Curated by Minhazz Majumdar, the exhibition presents over 50 paintings and traces the late artist's journey into art, which began in her late sixties. The exhibition will remain on view until March 11 and is closed on Mondays. It brings together works that draw from Baiga cosmology, forest life and lived experience in Umari district of Madhya Pradesh, where Jodhaiya Bai spent much of her life. Jodhaiya Bai Baiga began painting after years of working as a labourer and gathering forest produce. Her early experiments with clay, gourds and papier mâché later developed into acrylic paintings on paper and canvas. Her



visual language is marked by recurring images of forest landscapes, ritual figures, deities and animals, reflecting both cultural memory and ecological awareness. Several works address environmental change and loss, including responses to forest fires and degradation. These themes are embedded within compositions rooted in oral traditions and indigenous knowledge systems rather than overt commentary. Jodhaiya Bai was awarded the Nari Shakti Puraskar in 2022 and the Padma Shri in 2023. Her work has been shown in India and internationally, including exhibitions in Milan and Paris.

Delhi Freezes at 2.9 Degrees Celsius As Cold Wave Intensifies

NEW DELHI: (AGENCY)

New Delhi reeled under an intense cold spell as temperatures dipped sharply across the national capital, with Ayanagar recording the lowest minimum temperature at 2.9 degrees Celsius, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

Several parts of the city witnessed cold wave conditions on Sunday night, with minimum temperatures plunging close to the three-degree mark. Palam recorded a minimum temperature of 3.0 degrees Celsius, its lowest in several years. IMD data suggests that similar cold conditions are likely to persist through the day.

At Safdarjung, the minimum temperature was 4.8 degrees Celsius on Sunday night and is expected to drop further to around 3 degrees Celsius tonight. The



Ridge station recorded a minimum temperature of 3.7 degrees Celsius, while the maximum temperature there reached 18.8 degrees Celsius. Furthermore, air pollution levels remained a concern. According to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), Delhi's overall Air Quality Index (AQI) stood at 293, falling under the 'poor' category as of 7 am on Monday. This marked a slight rise compared to Saturday's AQI reading of

morning, with temperatures around 6.6 degrees Celsius in the early hours. A thin layer of smog reduced visibility across several areas, adding to the discomfort faced by residents. On Friday, minimum temperatures hovered around 5 degrees Celsius as cold weather continued to grip the capital. Meanwhile, rehearsals for the 77th Republic Day parade are underway on Kartavya Path amid harsh winter conditions.

Four trunk drains on the anvil to fix Capital's waterlogging woes

NEW DELHI: (AGENCY)

The Delhi Government has intensified efforts to address chronic waterlogging by accelerating the construction and expansion of four major trunk drains across the Capital, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta said on Sunday. The projects, being implemented under a revamped Drainage Master Plan, are aimed at providing long-term relief to areas that have faced repeated flooding during the monsoon for years. Gupta said the plan was originally prepared in the 1970s and failed to keep pace with rapid urbanisation, population growth and large-scale construction. As a result, drainage systems became inadequate, leading to



severe waterlogging in several parts of the city. She said the present government had revised it by factoring in Delhi's geographical conditions, climate challenges and rising population pressure to ensure that such problems do not recur in the future. Among the major initiatives is the Mundka Halt Supplementary Drain project in West Delhi, which seeks to resolve waterlogging in Kirari, Mundka, Bawana and Nangloi. A 4.5-

km-long trunk drain is proposed parallel to the railway line, with a discharge capacity of 760 cusecs to manage rainwater from a catchment area of about 1,520 acres. The project, to be implemented by the Irrigation and Flood Control Department at an estimated cost of Rs 220.93 crore, will originate near Mundka Halt Station and merge with the Supplementary Drain. An MoU has already been signed with the Railways for use of railway land, and the drain is expected to be completed within 15 months after final approvals. In South Delhi, the government has taken up a major overhaul of the MB Road storm water drainage system, where waterlogging has been a

persistent issue, particularly between Lado Sarai T-point and Pul Prahadpur. The project covers a road length of 11.38 km.

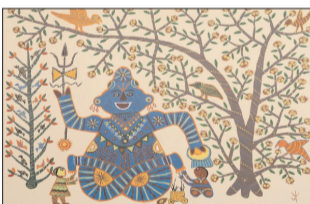

'Bloom at Dusk': a solo exhibition by Jodhaiya Bai Baiga

A solo exhibition titled 'Bloom at Dusk', showcasing works by indigenous artist Jodhaiya Bai Baiga (1937-2024), will open at Ojas Art, New Delhi, on January 23. Curated by Minhazz Majumdar, the exhibition presents over 50 paintings and traces the late artist's journey into art, which began in her late sixties. The exhibition will remain on view until March 11 and is closed on Mondays. It brings together works that draw from Baiga cosmology, forest life and lived experience in Umariya district of Madhya Pradesh, where Jodhaiya Bai spent much of her life. Jodhaiya Bai Baiga began painting after years of working as a labourer and gathering forest produce. Her early experiments with clay, gourds and papier mâché later developed into acrylic paintings on paper and canvas. Her



visual language is marked by recurring images of forest landscapes, ritual figures, deities and animals, reflecting both cultural memory and ecological awareness. Several works address environmental change and loss, including responses to forest fires and degradation. These themes are embedded within compositions rooted in oral traditions and indigenous knowledge systems rather than overt commentary. Jodhaiya Bai was awarded the Nari Shakti Puraskar in 2022 and the Padma Shri in 2023. Her work has been shown in India and internationally, including exhibitions in Milan and Paris.

Delhi Freezes at 2.9 Degrees Celsius As Cold Wave Intensifies

NEW DELHI : (AGENCY)

New Delhi reeled under an intense cold spell as temperatures dipped sharply across the national capital, with Ayanagar recording the lowest minimum temperature at 2.9 degrees Celsius, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

Several parts of the city witnessed cold wave conditions on Sunday night, with minimum temperatures plunging close to the three-degree mark. Palam recorded a minimum temperature of 3.0 degrees Celsius, its lowest in several years. IMD data suggests that similar cold conditions are likely to persist through the day.

At Safdarjung, the minimum temperature was 4.8 degrees Celsius on Sunday night and is expected to drop further to around 3 degrees Celsius tonight. The



Ridge station recorded a minimum temperature of 3.7 degrees Celsius, while the maximum temperature there reached 18.8 degrees Celsius. Furthermore, air pollution levels remained a concern. According to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), Delhi's overall Air Quality Index (AQI) stood at 293, falling under the 'poor' category as of 7 am on Monday. This marked a slight rise compared to Saturday's AQI reading of 291. As per AQI classification, a reading between 0 and 50 is 'good', 51 to 100 'satisfactory', 101 to 200 'moderate', 201 to 300 'poor', 301 to 400 'very poor' and 401 to 500 'severe'. A thin layer of fog blanketed areas such as Dhaula Kuan and Sarai Kale Khan during the early morning hours. Meanwhile, cold conditions have persisted over the past few days. The capital woke up to a windy and chilly Sunday

morning, with temperatures around 6.6 degrees Celsius in the early hours. A thin layer of smog reduced visibility across several areas, adding to the discomfort faced by residents. On Saturday, the minimum temperature dipped to 5.4 degrees Celsius, with rainfall reported in parts of the city. On Friday, minimum temperatures hovered around 5 degrees Celsius as cold weather continued to grip the capital. Meanwhile, rehearsals for the 77th Republic Day parade are underway on Kartavya Path amid harsh winter conditions.

Four trunk drains on the anvil to fix Capital's waterlogging woes

The Delhi Government has intensified efforts to address chronic waterlogging by accelerating the construction and expansion of four major trunk drains across the Capital, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta said on Sunday. The projects, being implemented under a revamped Drainage Master Plan, are aimed at providing long-term relief to areas that have faced repeated flooding during the monsoon for years. Gupta said the plan was originally prepared in the 1970s and failed to keep pace with rapid urbanisation, population growth and large-scale construction. As a result, drainage systems became inadequate, leading to



severe waterlogging in several parts of the city. She said the present government had revised it by factoring in Delhi's geographical conditions, climate challenges and rising population pressure to ensure that such problems do not recur in the future. Among the major initiatives is the Mundka Halt Supplementary Drain project in West Delhi, which seeks to resolve waterlogging in Kirari, Mundka, Bawana and Nangloi. A 4.5-

km-long trunk drain is proposed parallel to the railway line, with a discharge capacity of 760 cusecs to manage rainwater from a catchment area of about 1,520 acres. The project to be implemented by the Irrigation and Flood Control Department at an estimated cost of Rs 220.93 crore, will originate near Mundka Halt Station and merge with the Supplementary Drain. An MoU has already been signed with the Railways for use of railway land and the drain is expected to be completed within 15 months after final approvals. In South Delhi, the government has taken up a major overhaul of the MB Road storm water drainage system, where waterlogging has been a

persistent issue, particularly between Lado Sarai T-point and Pul Prahladpur. The project covers a road length of 11.38 km.
